8-4 Memorial Survey

- Survey open for approximately 4 weeks
- Sent to victim families, survivors, OD businesses, OD neighborhood, & first responders
- 151 total responses
 - 36 OD businesses
 - 69 OD neighborhood
 - 16 victim families/survivors
 - 30 first responders
- 24 individuals indicated they would like to participate in a focus group

Q1. How important is it to you that the permanent memorial be located on Fifth Street in the Oregon District?

Approx. 61% responded that this was extremely or very important

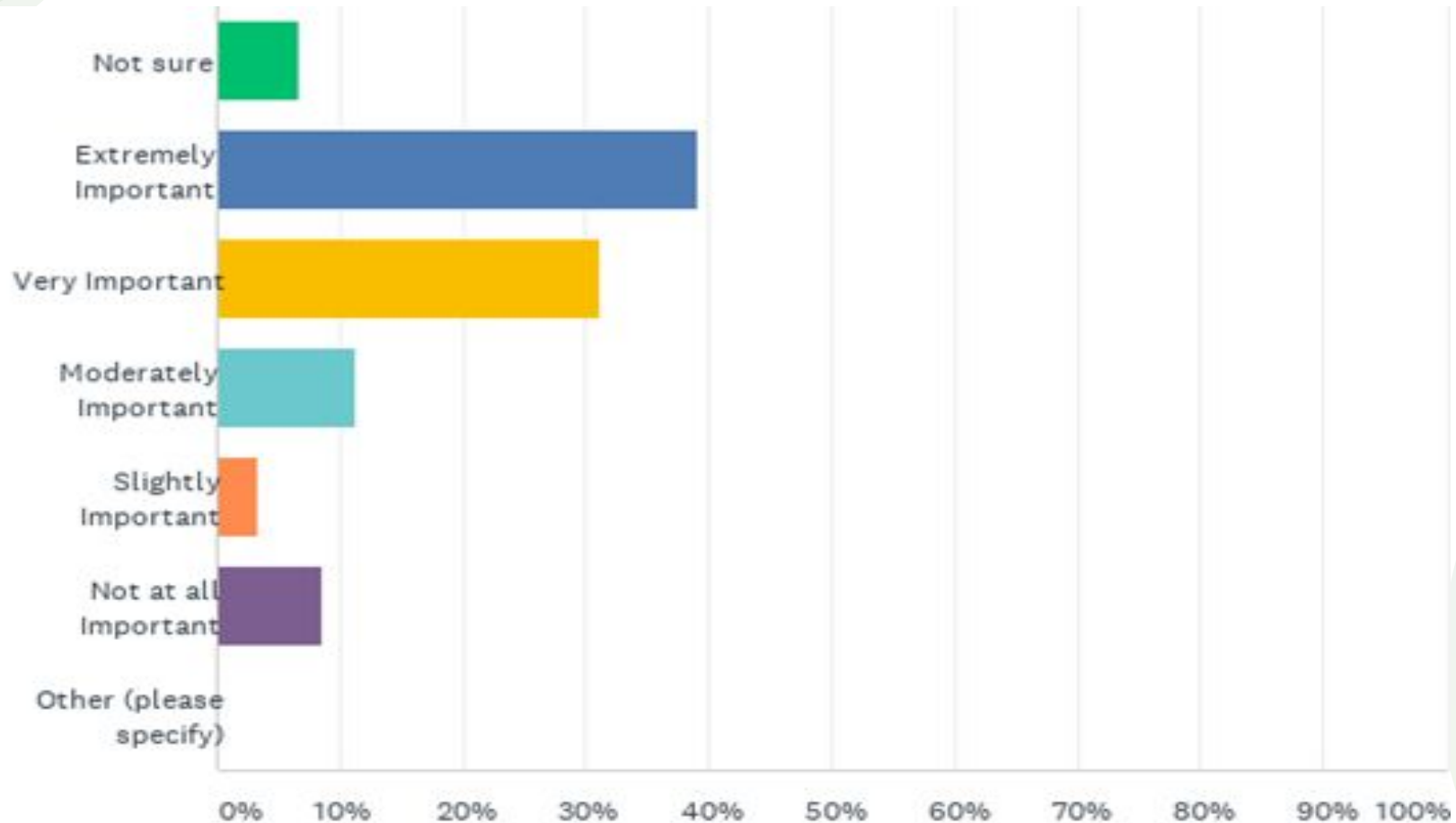
Over 60 percent of respondents indicated it is extremely important or very important the artist take the following elements into consideration:

Appeals to all ages

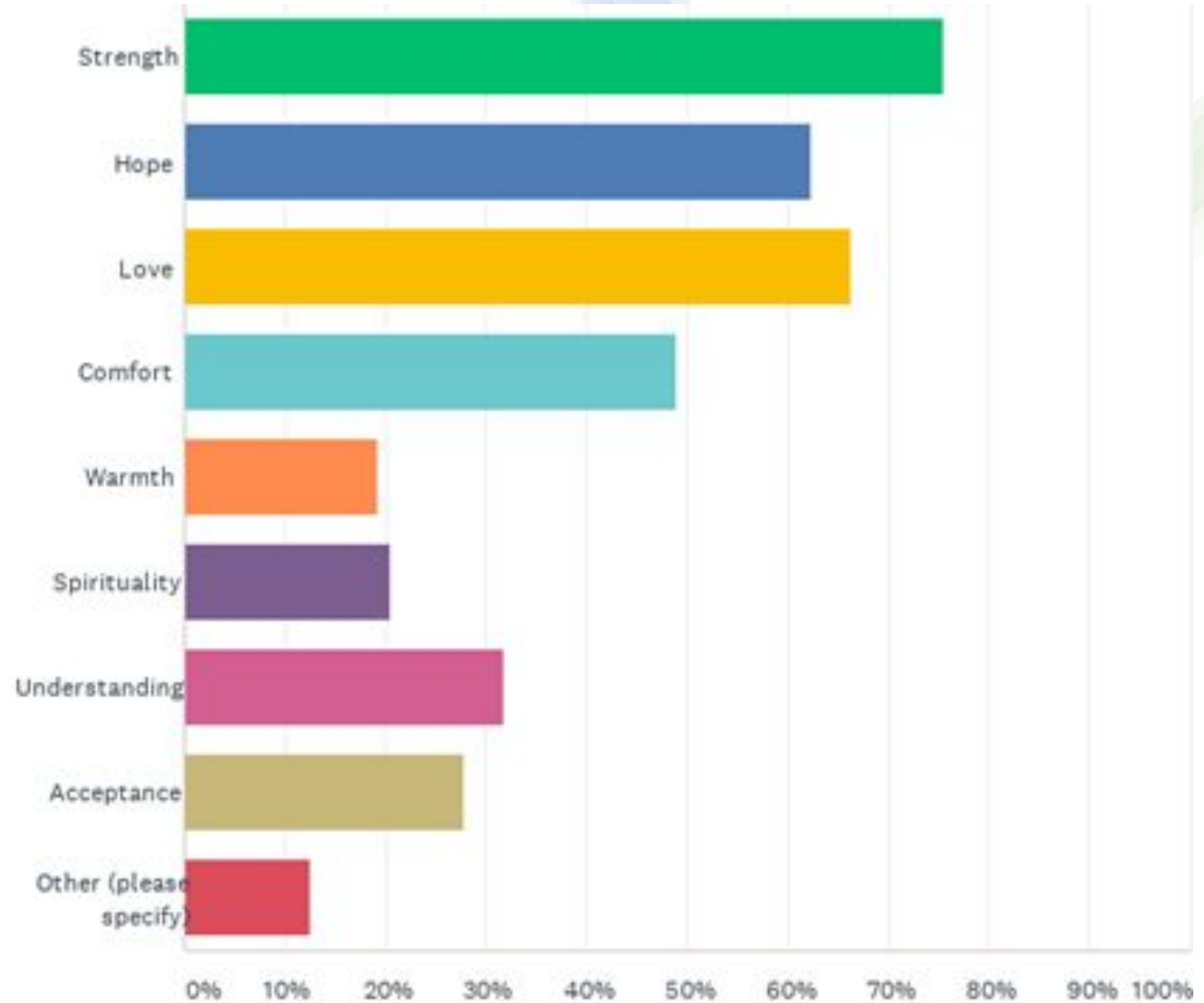
